2024 was a year unlike any other for TomTod Ideas - one of both deep challenge and deep growth. My personal journey took an unexpected turn in April with a brain tumor diagnosis, bringing uncertainty and shifts for both me and our organization. Yet through it all, one thing never wavered: our belief in the brilliance of middle schoolers.

Despite the challenges, we saw middle schoolers rise, dream boldly, and create real change. We expanded our curriculum development and training services, partnering with both school districts and youth development organizations. We honed our skills and refined our team structure with future sustainability in mind. We worked alongside incredible student groups who tackled real-world problems with creativity and compassion - all while they secured grant funding for their own ideas and initiatives.













2024 Revenue*
